## Week 8: A New Community 2.0 Embrace

- 1. Rick mentioned that "God is not all you need." Why is it important for us to be part of a community and not just have a relationship with God alone? Follow up: How does **Genesis**1:26 shape your understanding of community? Why do you think God designed us this way?
- 2. **NOT OPTIONAL:** Why do you think Jesus chose to spend most of his ministry time in a small group rather than giving individual lessons? Follow up: **Belonging** is essential to **becoming**. **Read Acts 2:42**. How does being part of a community help you grow into the best reflection of Jesus? How has being in community helped you in your spiritual journey?
- 3. **IT'S RELATIONAL:** Following together *informs my faith*. Read Ephesians 4:11-12. How does gathering together as a church help keep our faith story intact? What are some ways your faith has been strengthened by communal worship or Bible study?
- 4. IT'S RELATIONAL: Following together strengthens my resilience. Read Hebrews 10:24-25. Share a time when you found renewed strength because of someone's thoughtful encouragement. Follow up: What are some practical ways we can "encourage one another" within our small group?
- 5. IT'S RELATIONAL: Following together exercises my love muscles. Read Romans 15:7 and 1 Thessalonians 4:9-10. Why is it important to embrace the messiness of community? How does dealing with "messy" relationships help us grow in love and grace? Follow up: In what ways does digital community fall short compared to real, physical fellowship? How can we ensure that our church communities offer genuine, supportive relationships?
- 6. **IT'S RELATIONAL:** Following together *honors my rabbi*. Read Acts 2:46-47. What struck you most about the descriptions of the early church community in this passage? What can we learn from their powerful example? Follow up: How does our community life serve as a witness to others about the reality of Jesus?
- 7. **Coming** is essential to **becoming**. What steps can our group take to follow Jesus better together? How can you encourage others to join and participate actively in our group?
