

Jesus has a message of good news that is for every 1. This series explores that message of hope, healing, grace, and salvation, and asks each 1 who follows Jesus to share it with some 1 who doesn't...because that's what Jesus did!

Week 1: "SALVATION HAS COME"

- 1. Rick shared about visiting some of our church plants. How does that inspire us to think about the broader mission of the church? Follow up: Jesus expects His followers to be with Him, become like Him, and do what He did. What does this expectation mean for us today?
- 2. WHAT JESUS DID: Jesus proclaimed the good news and reclaimed people from darkness. Read Mark 3:13-15, Luke 4:16-19, and Acts 10:38. How do these passages collectively describe the mission and actions of Jesus? Follow up: Rick also mentioned that "there is no such thing as word-less discipleship." What do you think this means, and how does it challenge our understanding of Christian witness (see 2 Corinthians 5:19-20)?
- 3. **Jesus announced that salvation has come for 1 and all.** Read Luke 19:1-10. Who do you know like Zach? Share a story of someone you know that most people thought would never become a Christian. What do stories like these call us to remember?
- 4. **God sees every 1.** Rick mentioned that "Not 1 person far from God can escape the notice or concern of God." How does this truth affect our view of those who seem far from God?
- 5. **God seeks each 1.** Discuss the significance of the term "lost" as used by Jesus in verses like **Luke 15:4, 6, 9, 32.** How does this term reflect both a state of value and a state of hope? Follow up: Reflect on the statement: "God never stops caring about people who have stopped caring about Him." How might this truth influence your approach to evangelism?
- 6. God can save any 1. Read 1 John 4:14 and 1 Timothy 1:15. How do these verses reinforce the idea that salvation is available to everyone? How does this belief impact your approach to evangelism? Follow up: Reflect on the statement: "If you knew my whole story you'd know that there's hope for you too." How can sharing our stories be an effective way to communicate the gospel?
- 7. Read 2 Peter 3:9. Rick closed by pointing out that every lost person you know is some 1 God wants to find. Who is your '1,' and what steps can you take this week to share the message that 'salvation has come' with them? Spend time praying for your '1s.'
